NOTICE TO THE WOLLOMBI VALLEY COMMUNITY

Committee members of the Wollombi Valley Chamber of Commerce and the Wollombi Valley Community Association attended a meeting arranged by Cessnock Council at Wollombi Tennis Club on 21 November 2025 in relation to Council's proposed Special Rate Variation.

Notwithstanding the manner in which the meeting was organised and conducted, we understand that budget repair is required to address Council's financial situation and to support its sustainability into the future. 38 Councils in NSW have applied for Special Rate Variations over the last 5 years, citing inflation, especially in relation to the cost of maintaining infrastructure and operations. Cessnock Council's situation is compounded by the vast network of local roads, as we in the Valley are acutely aware, the maintenance of which is beyond the financial and practical means of Council.

Cognisant of cost living pressures and the significant burden the proposed 39.9% SRV would have on residents of the Wollombi Valley, we are seeking information on all alternatives considered. Further, given the history of gross neglect of our local roads and infrastructure and the limited services available in the Valley, we are seeking evidence of structural reform and information on, and input into, Council's future investment plans.

While we consider some rate rise is inevitable, we are concerned to ensure that residents are appropriately informed going forward, and that we take every opportunity to improve outcomes for Wollombi Valley. We are keen to hear from community members who have ideas that support sustainability of our Villages and community into the future, particularly in relation to Council services, investment or other support. Summary of the recent Cessnock City Council presentation

COUNCIL PROPOSES 39.9% RATE RISE

Council recently held a series of briefings on its proposed application to IPART (<https://tinyurl.com/IP399>) for a Special Variation to raise rates across the LGA by 39.9%. Below is a summary of the presentation at the recent Wollombi session.

Proceedings were opened by the Cessnock Mayor, Daniel Watton. Daniel introduced the consultant - Professor Joseph Drew - a local government expert, who led the council review and is writing the application to IPART for an increase in rates. See <https://tinyurl.com/WC399> for a description of the review.

The essence of the application is to prove its reasonableness. The bulk of Joseph's presentation thus covered the evidence of reasonableness:

1. Budget projections show ongoing deterioration over the next 10 years if rates are not raised.
2. The rates in Cessnock are low compared to similar Councils.
3. There are compounding factors; compared to similar Councils, indigeneity is three times the average, but we are on the median with state pensioners.
4. Analysis of ABS data proves the affordability of the rise to rate payers.
5. NSW Treasury recently and independently rejected a loan application by Cessnock Council on the basis of financial unsustainability.
6. The efficiency of our Council is middle-of-the-ground against an international 'Council Efficiency' metric, when compared to others. (Between median and average).
7. The largest budget line is roads.
8. Staff is 23% and are paid in the lowest tier compared to other Councils.
9. Management salaries are below par; there is no glaring evidence of mismanagement and it is an effective management team.
10. As part of his analysis he did a culling of dud and non-deliverable budget items, resulting in minor savings.
11. He also made recommendations about balance sheet write-off practises, that have been incorporated going forward and further highlight the long-term budgetary non-viability.
12. If rates are not raised, the Council will be declared bankrupt in a few years' time - the downside of this is that Administrators focus on cashflow and balance sheet decisions and community considerations take a back seat. The community is often left worse off than before (but with a balanced budget and fewer communal assets).
13. His advice is that if a rise is successful, not to pursue a leadership spill - the current team is doing well under the circumstances, and it will be important to retain organisational knowledge to see any change through.
14. He talked through case studies of how other jurisdictions had responded to rate rises, and the good and bad outcomes.
15. One of his recommendations is if a rise is granted, that 'benefits harmonisation' should be done, to ensure fairness of application and economic efficiency of a new budget.

Protect our Environment and Community:

Reject the Proposed Hunter Transmission Project (HTP) Southern Corridor

An e-petition has been raised to the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly, to protest the extensive and irreversible environmental damage which will be caused by the proposed Hunter Transmission Project (HTP) Southern Corridor through Olney State Forest, Watagan State Forest, Pokolbin State Forest, Corrabare State Forest, Corrabare North Flora Reserve and Jilliby State Conservation Area.

The impacts of the project include 762 ha of native vegetation cleared with direct impacts on 7 threatened ecological communities (TECs), 3 TECs listed as critically endangered, including potential serious and irreversible impacts on 2 TECs. There would be direct impacts on 38 threatened flora species, 28 threatened fauna species, including the critically endangered regent honeyeater (*Anthochaera phrygia*), swift parrot (*Lathamus discolor*) and three endangered frog species.



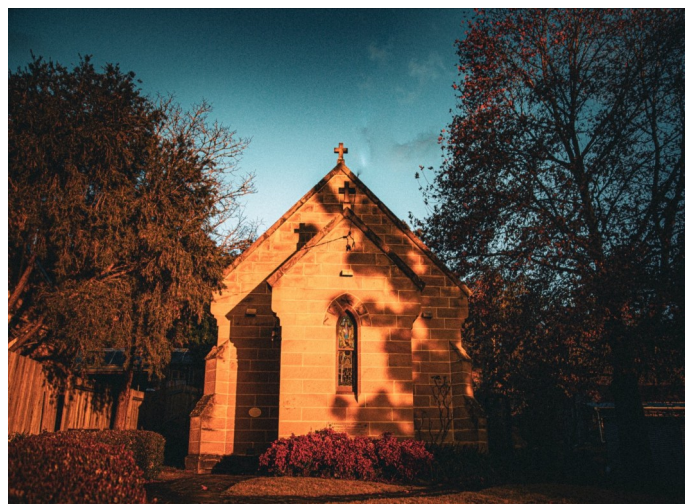

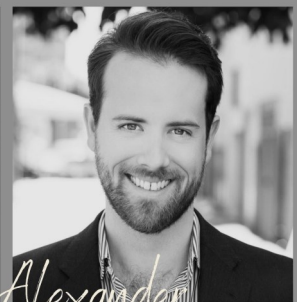

Weed of the month:

Aaron's Rod (*Verbascum thapsus*)

Its yellow spires are in flower now...

We were going to feature broad-leaf privet this month but will hold off on this until the January edition because Aaron's Rod is having a strong run at the moment!

Aaron's Rod, otherwise known as Great Mullein or Shepherd's Blanket, is a short growing annual or biannual herb that in spring produces a tall flower spike (one to three metres) from a spreading leaf rosette. It usually has one main stem and its hairy leaves are grey-green. Aaron's Rod produces bright yellow flowers that are densely clustered near the top of its stems. The flowers set ovoid, hairy fruit capsules that turn from green to brown before releasing seeds.

The plant typically grows in sunny well-drained sites, proliferating in disturbed ground, sandy pasture, creek beds and along roadsides. Aaron's Rod is believed to have medicinal properties. It is poisonous to stock though the plant is not often ingested because of the irritation caused by the tiny hairs on its leaves.

While the plant can be controlled by pulling out of the ground, you need to ensure you remove the entire long tap root and carefully dispose of the seeds. For alternative control measures, refer to the sources below.

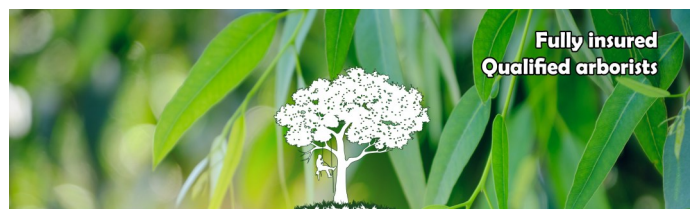
**Vale Evelyn Bloom

New Burrow Flap for Treating Mange in Wombats

Members of Wollombi Valley Landcare and a Sydney University student, have designed a new burrow flap for the treatment of mange in wombats:

1. It uses materials that are biodegradable, reducing the introduction of plastic and aluminium into the environment.
2. Is easier to assemble than current designs, meaning members can assemble it themselves from a supplied flat pack kit, versus previously being assembled by volunteers.
3. It is easier to refill while mounted while retaining a rain cover.
4. Comes with a more robust and versatile mounting frame, which performs better when force is required to mount in hard clay, allows hammering, while remaining bendable by hand in the field.
5. Has critical material safety and user instructions printed on it, to assist with in-field deployment and compliance.

Materials were sponsored by Bunnings and Edcon Steel. The Nepean Men's Shed, developed the laser-cutting model and also manufactured the first batch of flaps at a nominal cost, while a WVLC member designed and manufactured the first batch of mounting frames.

We are receiving good feedback from members who are trialing the burrow flap, and we plan to scale this to replace the current design in the next mange season.






