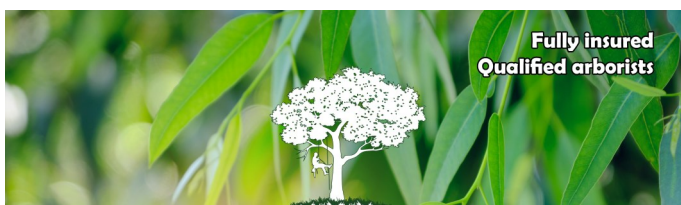

WEED OF THE MONTH

Broad-leaf privet (*Ligustrum lucidum*)

Coming into flower in the valley now

In November we featured narrow-leaf privet, an introduced species that escaped from gardens to infest moist soils and riparian zones. Its near relative, broad-leaf privet, is not typically as invasive but you may find it lurking near old homesteads and stockyards in the valley.

Broad-leaf privet grows much taller than its narrow-leaf equivalent, reaching 4 to 12 metres in height. It has larger, ovate leaves which are glossy and not unlike those produced by a camelia bush. Its cream-coloured flowers emit a similar sweet-sour aroma and set round fruit, or drupes, in winter. The seeds can be spread by birds, wind or water and the plant may also spread by roots and suckers.


Like all privet, the broad-leaf variety prefers rich moist soil. It is impervious to frost (though may lose its leaves in winter) and can outcompete native flora for habitat. The fruit and leaves are poisonous to stock and to people while the flower scent can cause respiratory problems.



Wollombi of Old

Wollombi. January 11th. 1855.

The despondency which generally prevailed from the long-continued drought, has been dispelled by that unspeakable blessing moisture. The grateful sound of pattering rain on the shingles was a joyous ushering in of the new year, continuing for three or four hours.

On Monday last, about 2 p.m., the peals of heaven's artillery commenced in the south-west and passed to the north-east. Soon after the wind suddenly rose and blew with extreme violence for upwards of half-an-hour, when the rain commenced, and soon after fell in torrents, saturating the earth to a considerable depth and the effect is already visible in the slight mantle of green that is now covering the earth. Some of the maize that was in tassel has been eaten off, but the rain that has fallen Bottom of Form will save a considerable portion of that crop, and green food for stock during the ensuing winter and thus the losses expected from death of cattle may be averted.

The heat during the past month has been much greater than the average of previous years. On to the 29th, it was unprecedentedly so, the thermometer being at the very high range of 108 in the shade. The water in the creeks and waterholes has sunk with unusual rapidity. During the month of December in previous years there have been frequent falls of rain during thunderstorms too often to the loss of the husbandman, who has had his stacks of wheat suddenly saturated but this season it has been placed under cover in prime order.
