## THE HISTORY OF WOLLOMBI VALLEY TENNIS CLUB

There is evidence that the tennis club was operating in 1934. No minutes available.

The Harrison family arrived in the valley in 1980. We were disappointed to see an unplayable court, cracked asphalt growing weeds with chicken wire fencing.

The community was searched for interested players to join the club to assist in court reparation. The club worked constantly with Cessnock Council since 1985 to develop and improve the facility.

In 1989 with a donation from Progress Association and a grant from council, as a temporary solution, a flexipave surface was laid at a cost of \$6,690, This enabled the community to play.

September 1992 a 527 council committee (later changed to 355 committee) was re-elected to include Cheryl Nesbitt, Kevin & Pat Evans, Robyn Butler, Colin & Jan Harrison, Malcolm Goudie, Wayne Montgomery, William Crump and John Field. This committee was to maintain and manage the facility. At that time, our clubhouse was the present day storage shed.

Under the presidency of Yvette Thompson in 1992, an interest free loan of \$4,000, was obtained from council, this to be repaid in \$250 instalments. This money enabled a synthetic grass surface to be laid at a cost of \$15,270. Yvette was president for 4 years, this followed by an election appointing Colin Harrison who continued to be president for many years.

During the 1990's so much work by members & the committee was undertaken. Many grants were applied for some granted, but more refused. Lights, tank & fittings installed with the grants. In 2000 a Licence Agreement was negotiated to replace council committee. This document is similar to a lease, it gives the club more control in the operation of the facility.

The club held the Australia Day Markets for many years. For a few of these markets the club invited St Michaels Church and Tidy towns to share the day. These markets were the least profitable due to the weather conditions. The profit for the club in 2002 was only \$2000, which was very disappointing when the work involved was the same as the other 3 markets for the year.

## COUNCIL RATE INCREASE 2026

### Application to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal for a permanent one-year special variation of 39.9%

At a meeting on 14 January 2026, Cessnock City Council voted to submit an application to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) for a permanent one-year Special Variation (SV) of 39.9%, inclusive of the applicable rate peg, to general income, commencing in the 2026/27 financial year.

The application is supported by extensive independent financial analysis, updated Long Term Financial Planning, efficiency and capacity-to-pay assessments, and a comprehensive community engagement program undertaken in accordance with IPART and Office of Local Government (OLG) requirements.

Wollombi Valley Chamber of Commerce (WVCC) and Wollombi Valley Community Association (WVCA) put a series of questions to Council regarding the proposed application to IPART for a rate rise of 39.3%. Read the response from Council to these questions at





## Celebrate Wollombi's Waterways with a Stunning New Mural

Over the years, many landholders have partnered with Hunter Local Land Services to restore waterway health through weed control, bank stabilisation, native planting and fencing riverbanks to protect fragile ecosystems. To recognise the communities' achievements, visitors to Slacks Park can now enjoy a vibrant mural celebrating the area's natural waterways.

Created by artist Daniel Joyce, the artwork features a riverine scene with native plants and animals found in the Wollombi Brook catchment. Alongside the mural, there is an informative sign with information about creek health and environmental DNA surveys. These highlight the communities' efforts as well as key indicators species like turtles, platypus and rakali, which are present in our waterways.

This project aims to increase community involvement, raise awareness about the importance of healthy ecosystems and promote continued improvements to riparian habitats. ## WOLLOMBI ENDEAVOUR MUSEUM



Standing on the corner of Wollombi and Great North Roads since 1866 is the old Wollombi Courthouse which replaced the original timber courthouse built in 1840.

While visitors to the valley often come to have a look it seems that many locals don't appreciate what we have in the centre of our village.

The old building operated as the courthouse until 1951 when it became the police station and then was repurposed as The Endeavour Museum in 1970.

The building now houses hundreds of local artifacts depicting the history of Wollombi which have been donated by local families over the last fifty years.

The new Wollombi Museum Committee is David Roache Convener, Lindsay Self and Nick Glover Committee members.

We have some exciting plans for the future and are seeking New Members for our Museum.

**Weed of the month:**

**Purple-top (Verbena bonariensis)**

Currently swathing the valley floor in a purple haze...

Over summer, you will have seen swathes of purple in our valley pastures, riparian zones and on roadsides. While it is attractive to bees and

butterflies, purple-top can quickly over-run native grasslands and pastures, smothering other plants.

In contrast to those blueish, prostrate verbenas that are also present in the valley, purple-top is an upright perennial plant, growing up to 2 metres high. It produces tight clusters of flowers at the end of erect, quadrangular shaped branches which tend to be hairy. The elongated brown seeds are starting to set now and will be spread over autumn by wind, water and animals.

The stems are often woody at the base and once the plant is established, it is deep-rooted and difficult to pull out.

# Wollombi of Old

**WOLLOMBI. February 17<sup>th</sup>, 1848.**

We know not of a more adequate method of describing the present agreeable season than by saying that it is a perfect English May, with the additional warmth of our own sweet Australian climate. The gardens present a most anomalous variety. Strawberries are in blossom, the grape vine has thrown out abundance of new wood, with a well-formed bloom topping their rich branches of nearly ripe fruit, and this has been the case both in the sweet water and muscatels whilst, in the orchard, the Worcester Pearman and golden pippin are in full flower, with fruit ripe or ripening. Of the latter fact the flying foxes seem to be perfectly aware, as they are nightly visitors of disagreeable and injurious character.

Various species of cabbage seeds sown on the 11th of last month progressed so rapidly as to be ready for planting out on the 5th of the present one, and have neither drooped or gone back in the least, and lucerne, twice cut since the month of November, is just now ripening into seed. The white moss rose and English cabbage rose, which the severe drought had prevented flowering in November, are at the present time giving fragrant evidence of being in full vigour and beauty. Pheasant eye, or small clove pink, is in its second blow,

We do not know whether it be that grapes are generally smaller this season, but in this locality, they are unusually diminutive in size, although the bunches are heavy.

You may have heard Council is introducing an opt-in fortnightly red-lidded bin collection schedule. There seems to have been a little confusion in some of the chatter on social media of late. I want to emphasise that changing from a weekly to fortnightly collection is totally your choice – it's simply an opportunity to reduce waste and save money (about \$95 a year for those who opt-in during the initial registration period). The change of service for those who apply by 30 January will take place on 23 February. If you don't want to opt-in, you don't need to take any action. Opt-in through Council's website.
